

Speaking Dadly animation – Partner comms pack

Background

Early year's speech and language is an important part of Greater Manchester's school readiness programme which aims to ensure every child starts school ready to learn.

As part of this work, a review of the Early Years Language and Communication Pathway identified that more needed to be done to support parents and families.

Following a piece of work undertaken in Salford to identify barriers to participation and strengthen engagement with dads, alongside an awareness of how “female-focussed” much of our early years support is, a short animation has been produced to help address some these issues.

Each message within the film is underpinned by the evidence of what works for dad in the hope that this maximises impact and take-up. The film identifies a range of ideas to incorporate language and communication into everyday activities which we know is one of the best ways of supporting the communication development of young children.

Audience

- Practitioners and professionals – those who work with parents/families from antenatal to starting school (0-5 years). This includes midwives, health visitors, those working in early years settings and services.
- Dads, with children aged 0-5, particularly those living in the most deprived areas of Greater Manchester.
- Wider family members, including mums.

Key messages

Overarching speech, language and communication messaging:

- Greater Manchester continues to lead the way in tackling the issue of school readiness, working together innovatively, and doing things differently to make sure no child is left behind.
- Greater Manchester had started to close the school readiness gap between children from our most disadvantaged communities and the rest of the country as a result of our investment in early years. However, Covid-19 has had a significant and detrimental impact on children's development and we are starting to see the impact of this.
- If the first three years of a child's life aren't filled with talking and language, they will struggle to thrive in later life. That's why speech, language and communication is a particular focus of the school readiness programme.
- Our work to ensure no child is left behind is part of our ambition for Greater Manchester to be a place where everyone can live a good life, growing up, getting on and growing old in a greener, fairer more prosperous city region.

Speaking Dadly messages:

- A project in Salford, delivered by social enterprise Unlimited Potential, looked at how dads can best be supported and encouraged to help their child develop their speech, language and communication skills from an early age.
- The majority of fathers recognise that speech, language and communication is crucial to their child's general well-being and future opportunities and helps build confidence and independence.
- The project also identified that much of Greater Manchester's early years support is focussed around the needs of the mother, which is impacting on dads participating with early years services and activities currently on offer.
- Greater Manchester is now working with dads to shape early years services that recognise the positive role of the father in a child's development. This includes creating more personalised support, more male-friendly groups, investment in health, wellbeing, and skills, and training for staff working across services for children and families.
- A short animation has also been produced to help address some of these issues and encourage dads to talk to and communicate with their child from birth.
- The film identifies a range of ideas to incorporate language and communication into everyday activities which we know is one of the best ways of supporting the communication development of young children.
- This includes simple activities like supporting play, singing and talking, looking at books together, and having some TV and electronic game free time.
- This work is complemented by the [BBC's Tiny Happy People](#) campaign, developed in partnership with the GMCA, to help close the pre-school language and communication gap.

- Tiny Happy People is a suite of free digital resources aimed at parents and professionals working with pre-schoolers, and comprises tips and advice, activities and short films about the science and facts behind language development.
- Additional resources include Greater Manchester's 10 Tips for Talking, which are evidence-based and aim to support parents and practitioners to develop the home learning environment and children's speech and language skills.

Voiced by local children, the animation encourages dads to tell stories to their children, chat to them when walking the dog or going to the park, and sing, talk and pull funny faces at their babies.


