It has been a busy term for the partnership. We started the new academic year reviewing and planning our activities.

As a partnership we have four working parties that support our work: School Improvement, Well-being, Financial Efficiencies & Curriculum and Transition. All have met and updated action plans to reflect our priorities.

Several training programmes were started for: Literacy, Teaching Assistants, Mid-day staff and Coaching. Our Sports competitions have also started again.

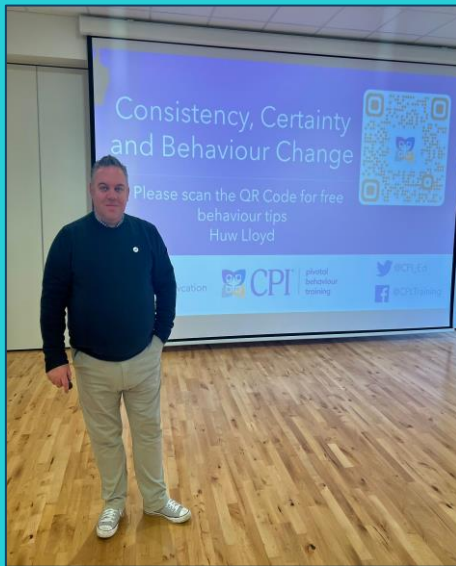
Networks are running for Geography, Science, Early Years, Moderation and SEND. With more to come in the Spring Term.

Peer Reviews have also begun again with a planned schedule throughout the year. St Agnes was the first school to take part partnering with Friezland. Julie Stevens is our external consultant and supporting the reviews.

It is good to be getting everything back on track following the pandemic.

Staff Event

In October we ran a staff development event at Saddleworth School. Huw Lloyd from Pivotal Behaviour Education gave an engaging and thought provoking presentation based on 'Consistency, Certainty and Behaviour Change'.



The session was based around the 5 principles of Behaviour and Cultural Change including:

- Consistent calm behaviour
- Sustainable routines
- First attention to best conduct
- Scripted interventions
- Restorative approaches

Following the morning's input, staff went back to their own school to work together on developing behaviour strategies.

As one head said: *"We are very confident in the behaviour management strategies we use, but this course has enabled us to review and refine our practice."*

Counselling

The DLP are delighted to have been able to commission the services of Debbie Pietkiewicz of Concentric Circles Counselling to work with children, families and staff at DLP schools for the remainder of this academic year.



Debbie has a wealth of experience in delivering counselling services. Heads have found more mental health issues with children and families following the pandemic and increasing opportunities to counselling support has been an ambition for the partnership. Each school will receive up to an additional 3 hours a week during term time for Debbie to help the school in whatever way they feel necessary. That may be direct counselling with children, support for families, training for staff or developing courses for families.
