Use equipment confidently and construct a simple base for constructing and modelling other shapes.

Join two parts of a model together successfully.

Experiment with different grades of pencils when applying different drawing techniques.

I can produce observational drawings of people and objects.

Create and use different tones of one colour, lightening and darkening using different colours.

I can begin to lighten and darken colours using paint and predict what colour it might be.

I can use different sizes and types of brushes for my paintwork and begin to control my Paintbrush.

Use a range of textiles and materials and describe the colours, textures and equipment needed.

Begin to control the types of marks and include curves and simple shapes.

I can mix, sort and choose different colours and be able to discuss the colours I like/dislike.

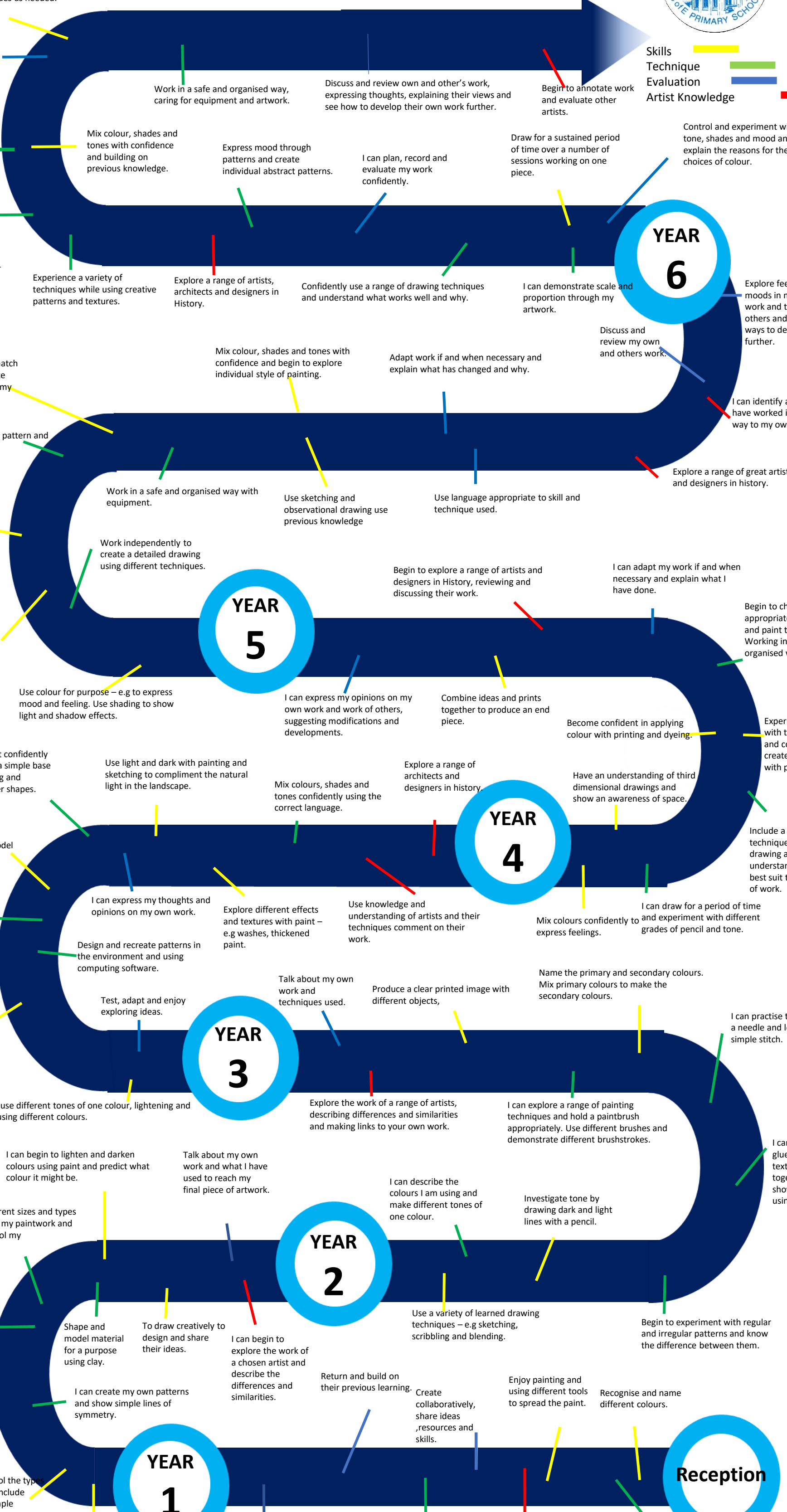
Use simple language to describe their work, colours and name the equipment.

Discuss and review my own and others work.

Explore a range of great artists and designers in history.

YEAR 5

Begin to explore a range of artists and designers in History, reviewing and discussing their work.

I can adapt my work if and when necessary and explain what I have done.

Begin to choose appropriate equipment and paint to work with Working in an organised way.

Use colour for purpose – e.g to express mood and feeling. Use shading to show light and shadow effects.

I can express my opinions on my own work and work of others, suggesting modifications and developments.

Combine ideas and prints together to produce an end piece.

Become confident in applying colour with printing and dyeing.

Experiment with textures and colour to create effect with paint.

Use equipment confidently and construct a simple base for constructing and modelling other shapes.

Use light and dark with painting and sketching to compliment the natural light in the landscape.

Mix colours, shades and tones confidently using the correct language.

Explore a range of architects and designers in history.

Have an understanding of third dimensional drawings and show an awareness of space.

Include a range of techniques when drawing and begin to understand why they best suit their piece of work.

YEAR 4

I can express my thoughts and opinions on my own work.

Explore different effects and textures with paint – e.g washes, thickened paint.

Use knowledge and understanding of artists and their techniques comment on their work.

Mix colours confidently to express feelings.

I can draw for a period of time and experiment with different grades of pencil and tone.

Design and recreate patterns in the environment and using computing software.

Test, adapt and enjoy exploring ideas.

Talk about my own work and techniques used.

Produce a clear printed image with different objects,

Name the primary and secondary colours. Mix primary colours to make the secondary colours.

I can practise threading a needle and learn a simple stitch.

YEAR 3

Explore the work of a range of artists, describing differences and similarities and making links to your own work.

I can explore a range of painting techniques and hold a paintbrush appropriately. Use different brushes and demonstrate different brushstrokes.

I can weave, glue and stitch textiles together and show pattern using weaving.

I can begin to lighten and darken colours using paint and predict what colour it might be.

Talk about my own work and what I have used to reach my final piece of artwork.

I can describe the colours I am using and make different tones of one colour.

Investigate tone by drawing dark and light lines with a pencil.

YEAR 2

Shape and model material for a purpose using clay.

To draw creatively to design and share their ideas.

I can begin to explore the work of a chosen artist and describe the differences and similarities.

Return and build on their previous learning.

Use a variety of learned drawing techniques – e.g sketching, scribbling and blending.

Begin to experiment with regular and irregular patterns and know the difference between them.

I can create my own patterns and show simple lines of symmetry.

Enjoy painting and using different tools to spread the paint.

Create collaboratively, share ideas, resources and skills.

Recognise and name different colours.
